

- This colouring book seeks to serve as an interactive and educational brief on Home Children and experiences from different homes in Canada.


WHAT ARE HOME CHILDREN?

- Home children were little kids from the
 United Kingdom who were sent to Canada
- These little kids were taken from their families and brought to new houses all alone
- Home children came to Canada for a better future, but sadly that was not what happened to many kids
- Many home children were treated bad, had to work tirelessly and lived in poor conditions
- Many little kids suffered because of the
 Home children program, and it is important
 that we never let this happen again
 (Government of Canada, 2020).




WHY DID THIS HAPPEN?

- WHO: 100,000 little kids from the UK
- WHAT: Kids were sent to Canada to live in new homes
- WHEN: From 1860-1940s
- WHERE: All around Canada
- WHY: These kids came from
 troubled families and backgrounds,
 the program told them that the kids
 would have a better life in Canada
- This was not true, and many kids were treated unfairly (Government of Canada, 2020).



FAIRBRIDGE FARM VANCOUVER

- Fairbridge Farm first opened in 1935, almost 90 years ago!
- Little kids as young as 4 years old were sent to Fairbridge Farm
- Kids had no time to play and have fun, they would only go to school and work on the farm
- The kids were very sad because they had to leave their mom and dads to come to the farm
- It was not until 1948 that children were not being forced to work at the farms anymore



THE NATIONAL CHILDREN'S HOME AND ORPHANAGE CANADIAN BRANCH

- The National Children's Home is very old too, It first opened 151 years ago!
- This was home to 3400 British Home children
- Kids who were 1-6 years old were advertised in the newspaper for families in Hamilton,
 Ontario to adopt them
- Kids who were 8 or 9 went to school and did housework for families
- And the older kids worked on a farms, shops and cleaned homes
- The Home had a lasting influence on the lives of its former inmates, as seen by the approximately 500 who enlisted in the military during World War 1 (British Home Child, 2016).
